Parent Tip

The best way to teach a child a new game is to play the first time open-handed. Second time, coach them each turn. Third time, if needed, explain other options only after they made their move. Rainbow Grapes

The cool grape and fun crunchy shell, make a great colorful snack!

- 1 Lb. seedless grapes removed from vine
- 1 Box of toothpicks
- 1 Box instant flavored gelatin (in the flavors your choose)
- 1 Bowl of water
- 1 Parchment paper lined cookie sheet
- Submerge grapes in bowl of water.
- Poke a toothpick through the top of the grapes.
- Pour the flavored gelatin into small bowls.
- Roll one grape at a time in the gelatin mixture and place on the cookie sheet.
- Place in refrigerator until chilled.

*If the coating is light or spotty, dab one side of the grape in the water and roll in mixture again.
